MAINTENANCE
CHECKLIST

Staying on top of a monthly home maintenance checklist is essential to ensuring that the time you spend living in your home is as safe and healthy as possible, in addition to keeping your home operating efficiently, mitigating risk, keeping your energy bills at a minimum, improving curb appeal and preserving or increasing your home resale value.

JAN	NUARY
	Vacuum your refrigerator coils.
	Change Water and Icemaker Filters
	Clean under and behind any appliances, and in all closets.
	Clean out the kitchen and pantry. Remove everything from the pantry, toss out stale and expired foods and wipe down the shelves before putting everything back.
FE	BRUARY
	Check your emergency supplies.
	Check batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors
	Check caulking and grout around sinks, showers, and tubs; repair as needed
	Clean and vacuum curtains, window blinds, and ceiling fans
MA	RCH
	Clean gutters: make sure they are flowing properly.
	Inspect roof for damaged shingles/tiles.
	Check flashing, and re-seal as needed.
	Clean lanai, pressure wash as needed.

APRIL			
Che	ck house and garage for any rotting wood, and repair as needed.		
Che	ck for spider eggs in lanai cage, they can duplicate easily if not cleaned.		
Che	ck and replace any bad caulking around windows, doors, siding joints, or anywhere else needed.		
Scro	pe loose window glazing, and replace as needed.		
MAY			
Clec	in windows and their frames when installing screens. Wash and repair screens at this time.		
Che	ck caulk or seal between house and drive, and repair as needed.		
Oil 9	garage door tracks.		
Trim	trees, bushes, and shrubs. (Wait until spring-flowering shrubs have finished blooming.)		
JUNE			
It's t	the start of hurricane season, be sure to stock up on supplies like water, batteries and stock your pantry.		
If th	e house or garage doesn't need paint, wash exterior off at least once.		
Loo	k for visible signs of carpenter ants, termites, or any other destructive insects.		
Rair	ny season is in full swing, be sure if you are a dog owner to check lawn for cane toads.		

JUL	Y
	Check your circuit breakers- click each one on and off and make sure that they're functioning properly.
	Check concrete drive, sidewalks, patios, and landings for condition and level; patch cracks, level, and/or replace, as needed.
	Clean carpet and tile floors.
	Clean your disposal- freeze vinegar in an ice cube tray and drop them down the drain with your disposal on. Not only will they clean, deodorize and disinfect your disposal, but the cubes sharpen the blades, too!
AU	GUST
	Patch and seal driveway (asphalt or concrete), and concrete steps/ landings.
	Perform a plumbing check- flush all of your toilets' and run all your sinks and showers.
	Check weatherstripping on all doors and windows, and repair as needed.
	Check all areas that need to be caulked, and repair as needed.
SEP	PTEMBER
	Make sure all garage floor or driveway drains are flowing properly.
	Clear gutters of leaves, check for leaks, and repair as needed.
	Inspect roof for loose or missing shingles, and check flashing seals; repair as needed.
	Clean and reseal decks, fences, or other structures made of pressure-treated wood.

OCTOBER				
	Oil garage door tracks.			
	Prune bushes, trees, and shrubs (except spring-flowering shrubs.)			
	Replace your HVAC filters (you should at least do this quarterly).			
	Deep clean your home- while you probably clean your home on a regular basis, an annual deep clean can really help maintain your home.			
NO	VEMBER			
	Shut off interior valves supplying outdoor water pipes to prevent them from freezing.			
	Check your hurricane supplies. Hurricane season ends this month, but you don't want to be low on items needed.			
	Repair any interior wall damage; touch up or repaint as needed.			
	Check and re-grout tile in all bath and kitchen areas, as needed, and apply a silicone sealer.			
DEC	CEMBER			
	Replace smoke alarm batteries.			
	Drain your hot water heater- over time, hot water heaters can accumulate a layer of sediment, leading to clogs and malfunctions.			
	Clean range hood filter and fan.			
	Inspect and clean light fixtures, and change any lightbulbs that need replacing.
